Moving to a foreign country is a scary idea. This is especially true if you must leave your possessions, friends, and even families behind. Nonetheless, millions of people do this every year, and many are breaking laws in order to migrate.

(1)The flow of illegal migrants is mostly from poorer countries to richer ones. More than 11 million unauthorized immigrants live in the United States alone. Approximately half a million try to enter the country illegally every year. Most of these migrants arrive in search of jobs, and in fact, they make up five percent of the American labor force. But in recent years, the European Union has seen the greatest increase in unauthorized immigrants. The EU Commission says that (2)over 276,000 people entered the EU illegally in 2014—an increase of 155 percent compared to 2013. Part of the increase is due to conflicts in the migrants' home countries. However, the main reasons are economic.

It is easy to feel sympathy for unauthorized migrants who just want the chance to earn a living. On the other hand, every country has the right to enforce its laws and control its borders. This is a very tricky problem, and no country has found a perfect solution. A balanced approach to the problem should include prevention of illegal immigration, punishment for those who profit from it, and the return of illegal immigrants to their home countries.

A sensible way to prevent illegal immigration is to create more jobs in the immigrants' home countries. If (3)they can find good jobs at home, they will have no reason to leave. A truly global economy would mean that each country has enough jobs. Second, people need to be warned against illegal immigration before they leave their home countries. If more people are educated about the risks, maybe they will be less inclined to break the law.

Measures to *penalize illegal immigration are also important. The immigrants, though, are not the only ones who need to be punished. Human *smugglers are those who transport immigrants into a country illegally, and (A) the immigrants must pay the smugglers a high fee, smuggling is a very profitable business. So is hiring illegal immigrants to work for very low pay. Punishment should focus more on the smugglers and dishonest employers. Finally, the laws need to be strictly enforced. The best law in the world is useless if everyone ignores it.

The final part of the solution is to provide ways to return immigrants to their home countries. It is best if immigrants leave of their own *volition. Their home country's government might even provide ways to help them return. Governments, however, must consider each case individually. Sometimes it is better to (B) people remain in their new country. For example, some immigrants cannot safely return home for political reasons or because of war.

Illegal immigration will continue to be a problem until economic prosperity equally reaches every country. Until that day comes, countries must start to cooperate with each other in the prevention, punishment, and return of immigrants to their home countries.
